NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION OPEN HOUSE  
MEETING

S-L56G(1012) Newberry Interchange to US-30, North Platte; C.N. 61758

The Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) will hold a public information open house meeting regarding proposed improvements on Nebraska Link 56G (L-56G) in Lincoln County. The meeting will be held at the Mid-Plains Community College - North Campus, at 1101 Halligan Drive, North Platte, NE, 69101, on Thursday, November 13, 2025, from 4:00 to 6:00 PM CDT.

Identified as *Newberry Interchange to US-30, North Platte*, the proposed project would improve approximately 2.03 miles of L-56G in Lincoln County. The project would start at the beginning of State Maintenance, which is approximately 0.20 miles south of the grade separation over Interstate 80 (I-80) and extend north to approximately the junction of L-56G with U.S. Highway 30 (US-30). Construction may begin and/or end approximately 500 feet ahead of or beyond the actual project limits to accommodate transitioning the pavement. The project would also reconstruct the ramp terminal returns connecting L-56G to I-80.

The purpose of the proposed project is to preserve the transportation asset, improve reliability of the transportation system and perpetuate the mobility of the traveling public. The need for this project is based on the current condition of the interchange and roadways.

Proposed improvements on this project would include expanding L-56G by adding two new lanes on the east side of the existing two lanes. The resulting roadway cross section would be a four-lane divided highway, and existing lanes would be resurfaced upon completion of the new lanes. The existing bridge over I-80 (Structure Number S080 17922) and the existing bridge over the South Platte River (Structure Number SL56G 00049) would be repaired. In addition, two new bridges would be built alongside for northbound traffic. The bridge-sized box culvert (Structure Number SL56G 00180) would be extended underneath the new northbound lanes. New right-of-way (ROW), utility rehabilitation, extensive grading, and culvert work would be required for the expansion of L-56G. In addition, roundabouts would be constructed at the junction of L-56G with US-30, and at the intersection where L-56G meets Halligan Drive and Hadley Drive.

The proposed project would require the acquisition of additional property rights, which could include new right-of-way (ROW), control of access (CA), permanent easements (PE), and/or temporary easements (TE). If your property is impacted by this project, you will be contacted by a representative once the design footprint has been established. Access to adjacent properties would be maintained during construction but may be limited at times due to phasing requirements.

Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in spring of 2029 and be completed by fall of 2030, with the potential to begin earlier.

This public information open house meeting is being held to provide information regarding the project, and to receive the public's input. All interested persons are invited to attend and present relevant comments and questions. Design information will be displayed and personnel from NDOT will be present to answer questions and receive comments. The information "open house" format allows the public to come at any time during the advertised hours, gather pertinent information about the project, speak one-on-one with project personnel, and leave as they wish. No formal presentation is planned for this meeting.

NDOT will make every reasonable accommodation to provide an accessible meeting facility for all persons. Appropriate provisions for the hearing and visually challenged or persons with Limited English Proficiency (LEP) will be made if the Department is notified by November 6, 2025.

The public is encouraged to make suggestions or express concerns regarding this proposed project. Comments will be collected through December 1, 2025.
