The Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) will hold a public information open house meeting regarding the proposed improvements to the US Highway 6 (US-6)/Sun Valley Boulevard and Adams Street bridges over Interstate 180 (I-180) within the city of Lincoln in Lancaster County. The meeting will be held at 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue Lounge & Social Hall, 2310 N 1<sup>st</sup> St, Suite 7, Lincoln, NE 68521 on Thursday, May 8, 2025, from 5:00 - 7:00 p.m.

Identified as ***Hwy 6 & Adams St Bridges over I-180***, the proposed project would remove and replace the US-6/Sun Valley Boulevard bridge (Structure Number S180 00255) and the Adams Street bridge (Structure Number S180 00164) over I-180. The project includes the length of each bridge plus 500 feet beyond both ends of each bridge.

The purpose of this project is to preserve the transportation asset, improve reliability of the transportation system and perpetuate the mobility of the travelling public. The need for this proposed project is based on the current condition of the bridges.

The improvements on this proposed project would consist of removing and replacing the US-6/Sun Valley Boulevard and Adams Street bridges and bridge approaches over I-180, removing and replacing the adjacent mainline pavement along US-6/Sun Valley Boulevard and Adams Street as needed, removing and replacing the sidewalk along Adams Street, updating guardrail, lighting, grate inlet replacement and construction, and culvert work. Surfacing would be placed under all new guardrail. Existing shoulders on US-6/Sun Valley Boulevard with curb and flume would be removed and replaced. Grading would be required at each bridge location.

The proposed project would not be constructed under traffic. US-6 traffic would be detoured utilizing Cornhusker Highway, N 1st/Charleston Street, and N 11th Street. Adams Street would be detoured utilizing Cornhusker Highway, N 11th Street, and N 1st Street. Limited nighttime closures of I-180 would be required. Traffic would be detoured utilizing US-6/US-34/O Street, US Highway 77 (US-77), and Interstate 80 (I-80).

Section 4(f) properties are located within the project area, including Oak Lake Park, Hayward Park, Salt Creek Levee Trail, Roper West Park, Roper East Park, and Roper Park East Dog Run. Access would be maintained to these properties during construction and no impacts are anticipated. Adams Street would be closed to pedestrian traffic throughout construction. Pedestrian accommodations across I-180 would be provided while the Adams Street bridge is closed.

The proposed project would not require the acquisition of additional property rights. Access to adjacent properties would be maintained during construction but may be limited at times due to traffic phasing requirements. Access to N 6th Street from Adams Street would be restricted for most of the project. Alternate access would be available using N 5th Street.

Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin as early as spring of 2026 and be completed by winter of 2026, weather permitting.

This meeting is being held to provide information regarding the project and to receive the public's input. All interested persons are invited to attend and present relevant comments and questions. Design information will be displayed and personnel from NDOT will be present to answer questions and receive comments. The information "open house" format allows the public to come at any time during the advertised hours, gather pertinent information about the project, speak one-on-one with project personnel, and leave as they wish. No formal presentation is planned for this meeting.

NDOT will make every reasonable accommodation to provide an accessible meeting facility for all persons. Appropriate provisions for the hearing and visually challenged or persons with Limited English Proficiency (LEP) will be made if the Department is notified by May 1, 2025.

The public is being encouraged to make suggestions or express concerns regarding this proposed project. Comments will be collected through May 23, 2025.
